The 25th edition of GLSVLSI will be held in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania, USA. Proposals for special session proposals are solicited. Special sessions typically run 1.5-2 hours. They can take the form of: (1) panels discussing visionary and/or controversial issues, (2) hot-topic sessions dealing with the introduction and discussion of emerging problems, and (3) embedded tutorials addressing recent technical trends that are of interest to the conference participants.

GLSVLSI 2015 highlights a special theme of healthcare and bioengineering from circuits to systems. In addition to this special theme, other topics of interest include (but not limited to):

- VLSI systems for sensing, processing and storing big data
- Bio/brain-inspired circuits and systems
- Fault-tolerant and resilient VLSI circuits and systems
- Hardware security and privacy
- VLSI design for cyber-physical systems

Proposals that address any of the aforementioned topics are invited. Proposals addressing VLSI-related issues outside of these areas will also be of great interest to the conference. They will be considered equally relevant in review process. Each speaker at the special session has the opportunity to include a paper up to 6 pages (minimally a 1-page extended abstract required) in the proceedings. All papers will be reviewed and then published in the conference official proceedings.

Special session proposals should follow these guidelines:

- Not exceed two pages;
- Should describe the topic, the format and intended audience;
- Must include a list of suggested participants with biographical data.
